Well, good morning, everyone. A while ago I was looking at Revelation 22:2, and a question came to my mind about this verse; this is speaking of New Jerusalem. So, let's start in chapter 21, verse 22 to set the stage.

0:00:21

That's Revelation 21, verse 22.

²²But I saw no temple in it, for the God Almighty (That's Yehovah the Father) and the Lamb (Jesus or Yeshua) are its temple. ²³The city had no need of the sun or of the moon to shine in it, for the glory of Yehovah illuminated it. The Lamb is its light. ²⁴And the nations of those who are saved shall walk in its light, and the kings of the earth bring their glory and honor into it. ²⁵Its gates shall not be shut at all by day (there shall be no night there). ²⁶And they shall bring the glory and the honor of the nations into it. ²⁷But there shall by no means enter it (That's New Jerusalem) anything that defiles, (is unclean) or causes an abomination or a lie, but only those who are written in the Lamb's Book of Life.

0:01:30 Now Revelation 22, verse 1

¹ And he showed me a pure river of water of life, clear as crystal,

No muddied water of false doctrine.

proceeding from the throne of God and of the Lamb.

0:01:44

Now here is the scripture that gave me a pause. Revelation 22:2.

²In the middle of its street, and on either side of the river, was (three trees) of life, which bore twelve fruits, each tree yielding its fruit every month. The leaves of the tree were for the healing of the nations.

0:02:06

It's interesting; I noticed for the first time, a couple of weeks ago, that there is actually three threes of life. I always thought that there was just one. But if you read that it says, but that is for another study. Anyway, there were twelve fruits for twelve months.

0:02:28

Throughout the Bible there are some famous lists of twelve. Twelve tribes of Israel, twelve apostles, and the twelve months of the year. And here, twelve fruits on the tree of life. So, if we look at the example of Revelation 22:2, I would ask, why would there not be twelve fruits of the Spirit?

0:02:45

My question is, do these fruits mentioned here in these trees, represent fruits of God's Spirit listed in Galatians 5:22 and 23. And if so, why aren't there twelve, not just the nine listed in Galatians 5? Let's go to Galatians 5: 22 and 23. Galatians 5, 22 and 23.

²²But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, longsuffering, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, ²³gentleness, self-control. Against such there is no law.

0:03:31

If you look back up to the beginning of that verse you will see that fruit is singular. You could say that's the character of God. It's singular, but it includes all these fruits. If my assumption of the twelve fruits is true, then Galatians 5:22 and 23 does not list all twelve of the fruits of the Spirit of God.

0:03:54

In fact, I found three more fruits listed in the New Testament. This morning, I want to go through the New Testament and point out where these three additional fruits are listed, and then look at each one of them in a little more depth.

0:04:23

So, I want to answer four questions. The first question. What are the three additional fruits, where are they found in scripture, why do we need them in our lives, and how can we produce more of these fruits in our lives? What are the three additional fruits. Well, I am going to tell you. They are righteousness, godliness and truth. So, let's look at each one separately.

0:04:45

What is righteousness? Righteousness is basically living in a condition that is acceptable to God. Acting in accord with divine moral law. To be free of guilt and sin. The Greek word for righteousness is G1343; it's the state of one who is in a condition acceptable to God.

0:05:17

A thesaurus is a great Bible helps tool, and Boyd Yahn put me on to that a couple years ago. It's a book that lists synonyms, words that mean the same, and antonyms, words that mean the opposite.

0:05:33

Now, here's a note, before we go on, that I want to read. There's one thing that the thesaurus has taught me during this study of the Fruits of the Spirit. These fruits all intertwin, and you can't live by just one or two. They are all needed, for example, in the definitions below, you will see that many of the same words appear in the definitions of other words. So, keep that in mind as we progress through this study.

0:06:06

Synonyms of Righteousness. Goodness: the state or quality of being good, Moral excellence; Rectitude: Rightness of principle or conduct, moral virtue; Responsibility: the state or quality of being respectable, having good moral character; Honor: honesty, fairness, or integrity in one's belief and actions; and Uprightness: adhering to rectitude, righteous, honest or just being in accord with what is right.

0:06:51

So, where is righteousness listed as a fruit in the scriptures? Let's turn to Ephesians 5:9, that's Ephesians 5:9.

⁹(for the fruit of the Spirit is in all goodness, righteousness, and truth),

Here righteousness is called the Fruit of the Spirit, yet it's not on the list in Galatians 5.

0:07:16

So, now let's take a look at a verse in Hebrews. That's Hebrews 12:11, if you turn to Hebrews 12:11, and we'll read this.

¹¹Now no chastening seems to be joyful for the present, but painful; nevertheless, afterward it yields the peaceable fruit of righteousness to those who have been trained by it.

0:07:40

Again, it's called a fruit. Next let's look at Thimothy, I Timothy 6:11, I Timothy 6:11.

¹¹But you, O man of God, flee these things and pursue righteousness, Godliness, faith, love, patience, gentleness.

If you note, righteousness is again listed. But this time it's alongside of the three fruits, faith, love and gentleness, fruits that are listed in Galatians 5:22 and 23. So, that puts them in the same neighborhood, the same class.

0:08:20

So, why do we need to be righteous?

Well, here is the first and great reason to be righteous, and that's found in I Corinthians 6:9; that's first Corinthians 6:9.

⁹Do you not know that the unrighteous will not inherit the kingdom of God? Do not be deceived.

So, that's a great reason for wanting to be righteous; because unrighteous people will not be in the kingdom of God.

0:08:52

Another great reason is found in Psalm 15, verses 1 and 2, where it says the righteous will live with God. Psalm 15, verses 1 and 2.

¹ Yehovah, who may abide in Your tabernacle?

This is Yehovah's house, and it's talking about living with God. And it goes on:

Who may dwell in Your holy hill?

Then David answers the question in verse 2.

²He who walks uprightly, and works righteousness, and speaks the truth in his heart;

So, that's the second reason.

0:09:35

The third reason is that those who are righteous will see God, the Father. I John 3, verses 2 and 3, it says:

²Beloved, now we are children of God; and it has not yet been revealed what we shall be, but we know that when He is revealed, we shall be like Him, for we shall see Him as He is. ³And everyone who has this hope in Him purifies (or cleanses) himself, just as He (God) is pure (or clean).

0:10:16

In other words, you need to become righteous, because that is what it takes to be clean and pure. That cannot be accomplished unless you live righteously. Matthew 5:8 says, that's Matthew 5:8:

⁸Blessed are the pure in heart, (the righteous) for they shall see God.

0:10:45

The fourth reason for being righteous is that God watches over the righteous and hears their prayers. Turn to Psalm 34, and verse 15. That's Psalm 34, and verse 15.

¹⁵The eyes of Yehovah are on the righteous, and His ears are open to their cry.

Remember what righteousness is? It's living in a condition that is acceptable to God. Psalm 34:15 is also repeated verbatim in I Peter 3:12. Now, we'll drop down, still in chapter 34, drop down to verse 17. It says:

¹⁷The righteous cry out, and Yehovah hears, and delivers them out of all their troubles.

0:11:29

And then drop down again to verse 19.

¹⁹Many are the afflictions of the righteous, but Yehovah delivers him out of them all.

Well, afflictions are like trials. Many are the trials of the righteous, but Yehovah delivers him out of them all.

0:11:44

Well, what can we do to fertilize and grow the fruit of righteousness in our lives?

First of all, beware of how you use your time. That may seem a little strange, talking about time and righteousness, but if you look at Ephesians 5, verses 15 and 16. Let's look at that, Ephesians 5, verses 15 and 16.

¹⁵See then that you walk circumspectly, (that's meticulously) not as fools (wasting your time) but as wise, ¹⁶redeeming the time, (And redeeming the time is making the best use of our time) because the days are evil.

0:12:34

Okay, now let's go to Colossians 4, verse 5; Colossians 4, verse 5.

⁵Walk in wisdom toward those who are outside, redeeming the time.

Again, making the best use of our time. Next, let's go to Psalm 4, verse 5; Psalm 4, verse 5.

⁵Offer the sacrifices of righteousness, and put your trust in Yehovah.

God, through David, calls our righteous acts sacrifices.

0:13:02

And Romans 12:1 says pretty much the same thing, so we'll go over and we'll look at that. Romans 12:1.

¹ I beseech you therefore, brethren, by the mercies of God, that you present your bodies a living sacrifice, holy, acceptable to God, which is your reasonable service.

So, being righteous is a living sacrifice. So, redeem your time and become a living sacrifice. That's just our reasonable service, not anything special.

0:13:42

Practice righteousness by living in a condition that is acceptable to God. Now, we need to practice righteousness. Let's look at I John 3, and verse 7; I John 3:7.

⁷Little children, let no one deceive you. He who practices righteousness is righteous, just as He (God) is righteous.

To become better at anything, we need to practice. Professional athletes practice all the time, over, and over, and over, until they get it down. That's basically what we need to do with our righteousness, or the righteousness that God wants us to have. We need to practice being righteous, over and over again.

0:14:38 Go to I John 2:29.

²⁹If you know that He (God) is righteous, you know that everyone who practices righteousness is born of Him.

Again, someone who is practicing righteousness is someone who is living in a condition that is acceptable to God. What a wonderful thing that would be.

0:14:54

And then third. Pray that God will grant you righteousness. You know, righteousness is something we need God's help have too. Let's go back to the book of Psalms again, Psalm 5, verse 8, where David prayed the following. Psalm 5, verse 8.

⁸Lead me, O Yehovah, in Your righteousness because of my enemies; make Your way straight before my face.

0:15:21

David had a lot of enemies, but we have a major enemy, and that's Satan. He's out there, we can't see him, but he is always trying to influence us and do something against us. So, we need to watch out for that, we need to pray that God would give us righteousness.

0:15:43

And then in Psalm 72, verse 1.

¹ Give the king Your judgments, O Yehovah, and Your righteousness to the king's Son.

Again, David prayed that God would give him your righteousness, as he said. Now, turn to Psalm 23, verse 3. That's Psalm 23, verse 3. That's the Lord is my shepherd, Psalm, and I just want to catch one little part of it there in verse 3.

3... He leads me in the paths of righteousness

So, there is paths of righteousness that we need to follow; that's doing what is right in God's eyes, along those paths.

Then David prayed in Psalm 25, and verse 4. That's Psalm 25, verse 4

⁴Show me Your ways, O Yehovah; teach me Your paths.

Yes, we need to ask God to show us His paths to righteousness. Alright, so that's righteousness.

0:16:46

Now, the second fruit that is not listed in Galatians 5 is Godliness. It's the Greek word G2150, it means reverence, respect, piety towards God, a proper response to the things of God.

Synonyms for Godliness. Piety, that's reverence for God or devout fulfillment of religious obligations, such as keeping the feasts. In other words, believing God and doing what He says. Sanctity, sacred or hallowed character. And then virtue, moral excellence, goodness, righteousness. Conformity of one's life and conduct to moral and ethical principles; uprightness.

0:17:41

So, where is godliness listed as a fruit?

Let's turn over to I Timothy 6, verse 11. That's I Timothy 6, verse 11.

¹¹But you, O man of God, flee these things and pursue righteousness, Godliness, faith, love, patience, gentleness.

0:18:06

Here, Godliness is listed alongside faith, love, patience (that's longsuffering), and gentleness. All of those are on the list of Galatians 5, 22 - 23. Okay, let's go to II Peter 1, verses 5 - 7. II Peter 1, verses 5 - 7.

⁵But also for this very reason, giving all diligence, (that's doing your utmost) add to your faith virtue, to virtue knowledge, ⁶to knowledge self-control, to self-control perseverance (longsuffering), to perseverance Godliness, to Godliness brotherly kindness, and to brotherly kindness love.

0:18:55

Here godliness is also listed with the fruits of the Spirit on the list in Galatians 5. Let's look at another verse in Titus 1, and that's verse 1. Titus 1, verse 1.

¹ Paul, a bondservant of God and an apostle of Jesus Christ, according to the faith of God's elect and the acknowledgment of the truth which accords with godliness,

And accords is agreement with godliness.

0:19:29

So, why do we need godliness? Well, first, to be profitable in the things of God. I Timothy 4:8.

⁸For bodily exercise profits a little, but Godliness is profitable for all things, having promise of the life that now is and of that which is to come.

Note, it says all things, not just a few, but all things are profitable for godliness.

0:20:02

To deny ungodliness and worldly lusts.

That's another reason for having godliness. Turn to Titus 2, and verse 12. Titus 2:12.

¹²teaching us that, denying ungodliness and worldly lusts, we should live soberly, righteously, and godly (that's godliness) in the present age,

0:20:31

And then another reason is that we need godliness to be content. I Timothy 6:6

⁶Now Godliness with contentment is great gain.

Godliness with contentment is great gain. Paul said that he had learned to be content. Philippians 4, verses 11 and 12. Philippians 4, verses 11 and 12.

¹¹Not that I speak in regard to need, for I have learned in whatever state I am, to be content: ¹²I know how to be abased, and I know how to abound. Everywhere and in all things, I have learned both to be full and to be hungry, both to abound and to suffer need.

With the fruit of godliness, we can learn to be content.

0:21:29

So, the next thing is, how can we fertilize and grow the fruit of godliness in our lives?

Well, the first thing is to set your minds on things above. Think about what you read in the Bible. Think about everything you read in the Bible; ask; how does it apply to me. Even in the very small things. Remember, thy word I truth. Let's look at Colossians 3, verses 1 and 2. That's Colossians 3, verses 1 and 2.

¹ If then you were raised with Christ, seek those things which are above, where Christ is, sitting at the right hand of God. ²Set your mind on things above, not on things on the earth.

0:22:13

Another reason is to guard your time. This is another thing we can do. Again, we come back to the time element. Consider how short life really is. I'm, as Terry Swagerty once said, on an extended warranty plan. God, under normal circumstances, gives us about 70 years. (I am now 78)

Turn to Psalm 90:10. It's Psalm 90:10 where God tells us that. It says:

¹⁰The days of our lives are seventy years; and if by reason of strength they are eighty years, yet their boast is only labor and sorrow; for it is soon cut off, and we fly away.

Our spirits go back to God. Our opportunity to create and grow is gone.

0:23:15

Ask yourself, how am I using my time? Our lives are like an hour glass, and many of us have only a small amount of sand in the upper chamber, and it's fast running out. You know, when we were young, you didn't see the sand move down as it ran out. But as you get older, you see that sand slide down really quick, and pretty soon it's all gone.

0:23:45

But yet, the sand continues to go out at the same pace of time, it's just that you don't know that when you are young. But you sure do when you get older. So, make the most of the time you have left. In Ephesians again, chapter 5, verse 16. That's Ephesians 5:16.

¹⁶redeeming the time, because the days are evil.

And Colossians 4:5

⁵Walk in wisdom toward those who are outside, redeeming the time.

And redeeming the time means, serving to offset or compensate for a defect, and the defect is wasting time. So, we need to redeem the time, buy it back.

0:24:28

And then another reason would be; surround yourself with godly people.

Being with people with like mind. I know it's hard because we are so scattered, but we have e-mail, texting, and we can call. We are the salt of the earth, and we season each other. We need their council, prayers, love and fellowship to grow and remain healthy in godliness. And fellowship of the saints will sharpen and strengthen you.

Proverbs 27:17. As Proverbs 27:17 says:

¹⁷As iron sharpens iron, so a man sharpens the countenance of his friend.

0:25:20

The third fruit that is unlisted in Galatians 5:22 and 23 is truth.

Pilate asked the famous question in John 18:36. He said, "What is truth?"

The Greek word for truth here is G225. It means: what is true in any matter under consideration. The Hebrew word is H571, and it means truth, as spoken.

0:25:52

Webster defines truth as: the body of real things, events, and facts: actuality. (What is actually there.)

God answers Pilate's question in John 17:17. That's John 17:17, it says:

¹⁷Sanctify them by Your truth. Your word is truth.

In other words, everything God says is true.

0:26:24

And then Psalm 119:160

¹⁶⁰The entirety of Your word is truth, and every one of Your righteous judgments endures forever.

Like they say, "You can take that to the bank."

0:26:41

So, where is truth listed as a fruit of the Spirit in Scripture?

Well, let's look at Ephesians 5:9.

⁹(for the fruit of the Spirit is in all goodness, righteousness, and truth),

Here, Paul calls truth, a fruit of the Spirit. Pretty hard to deny that. Ephesians 6:14; Next is Ephesians 6:14

¹⁴Stand therefore, having girded your waist with truth,

Truth is in good company in the remainder of verses 14 and 15, and here is the company that truth is listed with.

having put on the breastplate of righteousness, ¹⁵ and having shod your feet with the preparation of the gospel of peace; ¹⁶ above all, taking the shield of faith with which you will be able to quench all the fiery darts of the wicked one.

So, truth there is in good company; company of other fruits listed in Fruits of the Spirit.

0:27:51

Well, why do we need the fruit of truth?

Because liars, those not telling the truth will wind up in the lake of fire. We see that in Revelation 21:8. Revelation 21:8.

⁸But the cowardly, unbelieving, abominable, murderers, sexually immoral, sorcerers, idolaters, and all liars

That's people who don't tell the truth.

shall have their part in the lake which burns with fire and brimstone, which is the second death."

People that's pretty serious stuff for liars. It says "all liars" not just a few, but all of them.

0:28:40

And number two.

Truth is important because only those who speak the truth will live with God. Let's go back again to Psalm 15, verses 1 and 2. Psalm 15, verses 1 and 2.

¹ Yehovah, who may abide in Your tabernacle?

In other words, who will live with you?

Who may dwell in Your holy hill? ²He who walks uprightly, and works righteousness,

There's that other fruit.

and speaks the truth in his heart:

That is when no one is looking. You know, you're thinking truth all the time. You don't even think about lying.

0:29:22

And number three then.

Telling the truth then builds trust. Can you imagine God not telling the truth? Even if He told one lie, how could you ever trust anything He said? You couldn't! Let's look at Titus 1:2 for some assurance of this fact. Alright, Titus 1:2.

²in hope of eternal life which God, who cannot lie, promised before time began,

We can trust God's words because He cannot lie.

0:30:05

Alright, what can we do to fertilize and grow the fruit of truth in our lives.

Well, stop making bad choices for one. You know, if you don't make a bad choice, there's nothing to lie about. All you have to do is watch one episode of Cops to see how making a bad choice always leads to lying. They get pulled over and they say, "Do you know why I pulled you over?" "No sir" "Well, you were speeding." "Oh no, I wasn't speeding, you must be wrong officer." And on and on it goes. And then they tell one lie to try to cover the previous lie, and it's just like a big old snowball rolling down hill; the more it goes, the bigger it gets and bigger lies are told.

0:30:58

Let's look at John 8:44 to see where lies really come from, where they start out. John 8:44.

⁴⁴You are of your father the devil,

And He is speaking here to the Pharisees.

and the desires of your father you want to do. He was a murderer from the beginning, and does not stand in the truth, because there is no truth in him. When he speaks a lie, he speaks from his own resources,

His own character, that's the way he is.

for he is a liar and the father of it.

0:31:40

Ask yourself, do I want to do Satan's desire and keep making bad choices? Which father do you want to follow? Do you want the Father who tells the truth all the time, never lies, or do you want to follow the father you can't trust and who lies to you all the time. Well, I think that is an easy one to answer.

0:32:10

Another one is, keep your commitments. If you make a commitment and then don't keep it, that's the same as lying. God keeps His commitments; He keeps His covenants; He never breaks his covenants. People do, but God never does.

0:32:27

When God promises something, that's what will take place, He will always keep His end of the bargain. But humans don't, they make promises and the promises are just wind on the air, wind of air.

I know things come up, you know, you promise something and you know, you can't keep the commitment. Well, then you need to let people know, you need to call them, you need to let them know, you know that's fine because we are human, things happen.

0:33:00

I knew a couple of ladies who would always come, you know, they would say that they would be here at nine, and maybe at nine-thirty, ten o'clock they would finally show up. And they didn't think that was a big deal, but yet, you're sitting there waiting, planning you day accordingly, and they didn't think that was a big deal. But, that's lying, that's the same as lying.

0:33:24

Alright, then the third thing is pause before speaking.

If someone asks you to do something, your first response might be, "Sure I can do that." But later, you realize that you can't; so, pause to consider carefully what you are being asked before you answer. And here is just a small example.

0:33:52

If someone asks you, "How was your day going?" and you say, ah, great, when you are really having a horrible day. You know, that's not the thing to do. If someone asks you be honest, you don't have to elaborate, just say, "You know, my day is really not going so good." You know, that's an opportunity for them to try to help you, to try to lift you up and encourage you, and that maybe is just what you need. But if you say, "Ah, it's gong great.? There goes his opportunity to serve you, or her opportunity to serve you.

0:34:28

And then finally, take responsibility. Admit your lie and own up to it and be willing to suffer the consequences of that lie. Like the fellow who was pulled over for speeding. You know, he didn't admit his lie, or he didn't admit that he was speeding, he lied about it, no I wasn't, when actually he knew he was going ten or fifteen miles over the speed limit.

0:34:52

And then he had to tell another lie again and try to get out of it, and that only gets you deeper. The first lie you tell will require many more to try to cover over it. David said in Psalm 51, verse 3. That's Psalm 51, verse 3 and 4.

³For I acknowledge my transgressions, and my sin is always before me. ⁴Against You, You only, have I sinned, and done this evil in Your sight—that You may be found just when You speak, and blameless when You judge.

0:35:36

So, be willing to take responsibility when you make a mistake, when you do something wrong. You know, don't be afraid to admit it and then be willing to take the consequences as in the case, if you were speeding. Okay, you will have to pay the fine. But often times if you tell the truth, they'll cut you a deal. You know, the fine may be a hundred dollars per the book, but they may back it off and say well, I'll only write it up for three or four miles over, and that fine is much less than the other one. But you will still have to pay some. And that's taking responsibility and facing the consequences.

0:36:21

Well, in conclusion, we've seen that there were more fruits of the Spirit than the nine listed in Galatians 5; in fact, there are twelve in all. We looked to see what these fruits are, and we've seen why we need them. We've looked at how we can fertilize and grow these additional fruits in our lives.

0:36:53

As the years go by it's easy to forget that we need all the fruits of the Spirit in our lives. All twelve fruits are pillars of God's character, and they must also become pillars in our lives as well, so that we can live forever with God and Christ.
