Hello to all, it is May 15 of 2025 and this is part 5 of the Unmasking Evil series. Well, it's been quite a task looking up every reference to evil that could be found using Strong's, and it has been an education I must say. If this is an interest to anyone, I would highly suggest you do similar, for it is impossible to do so and not become knowledgeable, more knowledgeable actually about our Father and His Son, the Christ, Yeshua to some.

Before getting into the study specifically, I'd like to reference Christ's prayer, recorded for us in John 17, verses 20 – 23, and we'll just read that. John 17, verses 20 – 23.

²⁰"I do not pray for these alone, but also for those who will believe in Me through their word; ²¹that they all may be one, as You, Father, are in Me, and I in You; that they also may be one in Us, that the world may believe that You sent Me. ²²And the glory which You gave Me I have given them, that they may be one just as We are one: ²³I in them, and You in Me; that they may be made perfect in one,

That's the goal, if we are in perfect harmony with the Father and Jesus Christ then we will be at one with them; that just simply makes sense.

and that the world may know that You have sent Me,

He did come from God; He was God's Son.

and have loved them as You have loved Me.

0:01:53

Christ intimated that He and the Father are one; not one Being, they are separate Beings but of similar mind and approach, and we are, if we consider ourselves part of the ekklesia, to join them in that situation.

0:02:14

I recently asked a fellow who was familiar with the faith, but not of the faith; I asked him, "What is evil?" And his answer kind of surprised me, and yet not. He said, "The breaking of the ten commandments is evil" And I thought, well how about that. He gets it, and yet many practicing Christians would not really believe that definition, or even if they did, their behavior would suggest that they don't.

0:02:53

Do we think that Christ's definition of evil would be the same as the Father's, or would it be different? If the ekklesia are in the image of Christ, would their definition and understanding of evil be the same as the Father's? It has been long understood that if one takes to themselves the right to determine what evil is, and that it's a domain belonging exclusively to Yehovah, the Father, it's a death sentence.

0:03:31

That, of course, goes back into the garden itself, and the choice offered, the result of which Yehovah made clear. If you take of that tree, you will die. It is apparent that after looking at this topic as this series has developed, that the meme of not looking into evil is a spillover of the mindset of, if you decide for yourself, you're done. That seems to have prevented a looking into what does Yehovah actually say is evil, and aligning one's own view with that of our Father.

0:04:12

Wouldn't it be a natural thing for the ekklesia to learn from their Father what really is evil, and become one with Him in their thinking? If the ekklesia's thinking are perfectly aligned with the Father's definition of evil, would they not be at one with the Father and Christ, and fulfill that prayer of Christ's that we read?

0:04:44

Would Satan not seek to discourage such investigation, to hide what is evil from them? It would seem obvious to me, at this point in the study, the answer is, of course. If our understanding of evil is the same as the Father's and Christ's, we would be in agreement with them, and at one with them precisely as Christ laid out in His prayer.

0:05:17

We've been possibly discouraged from doing so; attention focused elsewhere as one of the tools to do so, distraction if you will. Would there be anything wrong, to look at scripture to find out what our Father viewed as evil and following that lead? I cannot see a reason that would be wrong, rather exactly as the ekklesia need to do.

0:05:47

And Christ pointed that out in Matthew 6:33; Matthew 6:33, and we'll just read that, Christ's directive.

³³But seek first the kingdom of God

The place where God lives and the values from Him.

and His righteousness,

There is such a thing as Satan and his evil and there is God and His righteousness as the polar opposite. Our admonition from Christ here, to seek that.

and all these things

You know, we do have physical needs, there's no question, us being physical people, but our primary focus should be actively seeking the righteousness of God and not the evil of this world. They are opposites.

0:06:52

John understood that, and he spoke of that directly in I John 2, verses 15 - 17. We live in the world and there's probably some things we quite like and quite enjoy, and yet the admonition in the scripture here is:

¹⁵Do not love the world or the things in the world. If anyone loves the world,

And its ways, which are contrary to God.

the love of the Father is not in him. 16For all that is in the world—

0:07:35

It doesn't say part of it, all that is in the world.

the lust of the flesh, the lust of the eyes, (and the pride of life—is not of the Father but is of the world. ¹⁷And the world is passing away, and the lust of it; but he who does the will of God

Opposite of the world.

abides forever.

0:08:01

Christ referred to the generation of His day as evil, and we did look at that, and I think it bears repeating. We'll just look at that quickly, in Matthew 12, and verse 39. Matthew 12, and verse 39, where Christ made an emphatic statement. He says:

³⁹... "An evil and adulterous generation

So, Christ recognized the generation in which He lived His physical existence.

seeks after a sign, and no sign will be given to it except the sign of the prophet Jonah.

0:08:39

So, He recognized the society for what it was. The apostles also did, as we will come to see more fully in this study. What then did our Father think of the conduct of His people Israel, back in the day? Is our Father's opinion of that evil and adulterous generation the same as Christ's, or is it not? What did Yehovah regard as evil? For surely, His future spirit born children will embrace their Father's values, perception and righteousness.

0:09:24

Going through the concordance, far and away the most reference to evil by Yehovah is in the book of Jeremiah. There are as many references as well in Psalms and Proverbs, but in the Old Testament, Jeremiah the most.

0:09:44

Curiously, when one looks at the term "wicked", Psalms and Proverbs gets the nod. Jeremiah was a prophet to Judah in and around their kingdom being removed from them by Nebuchadnezzar, and that removal was at the behest of Yehovah Himself. We would expect it to be rich in the Father's perspective, and indeed it certainly is.

0:10:17

Looking at them then, we can get Yehovah's direct thoughts as they are recorded for us, and so we'll spend a fair bit of time in the book of Jeremiah because it is very instructive into reading into the mind, or reading into the mind of our God, and our Father.

0:10:41

So, let's just set the context for this in Jeremiah 1, and we'll read verses 1 - 19.

¹ The words of Jeremiah the son of Hilkiah, of the priests who were in Anathoth in the land of Benjamin, ²to whom the word of Yehovah

So, the speaker here, the address is from our Father and our God

came in the days of Josiah the son of Amon, king of Judah, in the thirteenth year of his reign. ³It came also in the days of Jehoiakim the son of Josiah, king of Judah, until the end of the eleventh year of Zedekiah the son of Josiah, king of Judah, until the carrying away of Jerusalem captive in the fifth month.

0:11:30

So, it was a time when God judged the nation for what it was all about, and He sent them a prophet as it was His custom to do, to warn the people. Here's the directive.

⁴Then the word of Yehovah came to me, saying:

That's God the Father.

⁵"Before I formed you in the womb I knew you; before you were born I sanctified you; I ordained you a prophet to the nations." ⁶Then said I: "Ah, Yehovah God! Behold, I cannot speak, for I am a youth." ⁷But Yehovah said to me: "Do not say, 'I am a youth,' for you shall go to all to whom I send you, and whatever I command you, you shall speak. ⁸Do not be afraid of their faces, for I am with you to deliver you," says Yehovah. ⁹Then Yehovah put forth His hand and touched my mouth, and Yehovah said to me: "Behold, I have put My words in your mouth. ¹⁰See, I have this day set you over the nations and over the kingdoms, to root out and to pull down, to destroy and to throw down, to build and to plant." ¹¹Moreover the word of Yehovah came to me, saying, "Jeremiah, what do you see?" And I said, "I see a branch of an almond tree." ¹²Then Yehovah said to me, "You have seen well, for I am ready to perform My word." ¹³And the word of Yehovah came to me the second time, saying,

"What do you see?" And I said, "I see a boiling pot, and it is facing away from the north." ¹⁴Then Yehovah said to me: "Out of the north calamity (or evil) shall break forth on all the inhabitants of the land. ¹⁵For behold, I am calling all the families of the kingdoms of the north," says Yehovah; "They shall come and each one set his throne at the entrance of the gates of Jerusalem, against all its walls all around, and against all the cities of Judah. ¹⁶I will utter My judgments

0:13:29

So, it was a time of judgements on the nations.

against them concerning all their wickedness,

God had had enough. The descriptor here is very helpful for us.

because they have forsaken Me, burned incense to other gods, and worshiped the works of their own hands.

God regarded that as evil.

¹⁷"Therefore, prepare yourself and arise, and speak to them all that I command you. Do not be dismayed before their faces, lest I dismay you before them. ¹⁸For behold, I have made you this day a fortified city and an iron pillar, and bronze walls against the whole land— against the kings of Judah, against its princes, against its priests, and against the people of the land. ¹⁹They will fight against you,

They are not going to like what they hear.

but they shall not prevail against you. For I am with you," says Yehovah, "to deliver vou."

0:14:37

If we go into Jeremiah 2, we've kind of set the stage here. Jeremiah 2, and we'll look at verses 2 - 8.

²"Go and cry in the hearing of Jerusalem, saying, 'Thus says Yehovah: "I remember you, the kindness of your youth, the love of your betrothal, when you went after Me in the wilderness, in a land not sown.

0:15:07

They had left their God, although not completely, as we read in other passages. But it goes on to say:

³Israel was holiness to Yehovah, the firstfruits of His increase. All that devour him will offend; disaster will come upon them," says Yehovah."

So, they were the apple of God's eye, He brought them out to worship Him, and anybody that messed with them would find the going a little rough.

⁴Hear the word of Yehovah, O house of Jacob and all the families of the house of Israel.

0:15:46 Not only the Jews

⁵Thus says Yehovah: "What injustice have your fathers found in Me, that they have gone far from Me, have followed idols, and have become idolaters? ⁶Neither did they say, 'Where is Yehovah, who brought us up out of the land of Egypt, who led us through the wilderness, through a land of deserts and pits, through a land of drought and the shadow of death, through a land that no one crossed and where no one dwelt?' ⁷I brought you into a bountiful country, to eat its fruit and its goodness. But when you entered, you defiled My land and made My heritage an abomination. ⁸The priests did not say, 'Where is Yehovah?' And those who handle the law did not know Me:

0:16:16

They did evil before God.

the rulers also transgressed against Me; ...

Going down to verse 11 God asked:

¹¹Has a nation changed its gods, which are not Gods? But My people have changed their glory

They were given knowledge of the true God, and they didn't like that action at all. They tossed Him out.

for what does not profit. ¹²Be astonished, O heavens, at this, and be horribly afraid; be very desolate," says Yehovah. ¹³"For My people have committed two evils: They have forsaken Me, the fountain of living waters, and hewn themselves cisterns—broken cisterns that can hold no water.

0:17:43

So, not only did they reject God, they went on to build a foundation for themselves that was utterly useless. Going on in verse 14:

¹⁴"Is Israel a servant? Is he a home born slave? Why is he plundered? ¹⁵The young lions roared at him, and growled; they made his land waste; his cities are burned, without inhabitant. ¹⁶Also the people of Noph and Tahpanhes have broken the

crown of your head. ¹⁷Have you not brought this on yourself; in that you have forsaken Yehovah your God when He led you in the way?

0:18:24

In the way of righteousness.

¹⁸And now why take the road to Egypt, to drink the waters of Sihor? Or why take the road to Assyria, to drink the waters of the river? ¹⁹Your own wickedness will correct you, and your backslidings will rebuke you. Know therefore and see that it is an evil and bitter thing that you have forsaken Yehovah your God,

He comments here:

and the fear of Me is not in you," Says the LORD God of hosts.

0:19:01

And when we look around at society today, do we see a fear of Yehovah, or quite the opposite? Going down to verse 26.

²⁶"As the thief is ashamed when he is found out, so is the house of Israel ashamed; they and their kings and their princes, and their priests and their prophets, ²⁷saying to a tree, 'You are my father,' and to a stone, 'You gave birth to me.' For they have turned their back to Me, and not their face. But in the time of their trouble they will say, 'Arise and save us.'

But God will say:

²⁸... where are your gods that you have made for yourselves? Let them arise, if they can save you in the time of your trouble; for according to the number of your cities are your gods, O Judah.

0:19:53

So, they had replaced the true God with false ones, and were perfectly fine with it. This is an oft repeated theme in the book of Jeremiah, and we really shouldn't be so surprised. People, even God's chosen people, do not want to follow Him, they just don't.

0:20:16

God, commenting in Jeremiah 4, (verse 22).

²²"For My people are foolish, they have not known Me. They are silly children, and they have no understanding. They are wise to do evil, but to do good they have no knowledge."

God alone is referred to in scripture as good and they have no knowledge of God. And quite frankly, they don't want to have a knowledge of God, they love their evil more.

0:20:43

Jeremiah 6, we'll look at verse 19.

¹⁹Hear, O earth! Behold, I will certainly bring calamity (evil) on this people

So, God will bring evil upon people who choose the way of evil.

—the fruit of their thoughts, because they have not heeded My words nor My law, but (they) rejected it.

0:21:24

So, the words of God were not valued, in fact they were totally rejected by many, if not most. Jeremiah 7, we'll read verses 21 - 28.

²¹Thus says Yehovah of hosts, the God of Israel: "Add your burnt offerings to your sacrifices and eat meat. ²² For I did not speak to your fathers, or command them in the day that I brought them out of the land of Egypt, concerning burnt offerings or sacrifices. ²³But this is what I commanded them, saying, 'Obey My voice, and I will be your God, and you shall be My people. And walk in all the ways that I have commanded you,

0:22:16

Christ taught; the biblical Christ taught we are to live by every word of God.

that it may be well with you.' ²⁴Yet they did not obey or incline their ear, but followed the counsels and the dictates of their evil hearts,

Their hearts were not right.

and went backward and not forward. ²⁵Since the day that your fathers came out of the land of Egypt until this day, I have even sent to you all My servants the prophets, daily rising up early and sending them. ²⁶Yet they did not obey Me or incline their ear, but stiffened their neck. They did worse than their fathers.

0:23:02

From God's perspective, all His words are commands and ways of life that are good and not evil, but mankind, including God's own people, choose evil.

²⁷"Therefore, you shall speak all these words to them, but they will not obey you. You shall also call to them, but they will not answer you. ²⁸"So, you shall say to them, 'This is a nation that does not obey the voice of Yehovah their God nor receive correction. Truth has perished and has been cut off from their mouth.

0:23:42

If we go on to Jeremiah 9, we'll read verses 1 - 6. Keep in mind as we walk through this, this is how our Father actually thinks.

¹ Oh, that my head were waters, and my eyes a fountain of tears, (Jeremiah speaking) that I might weep day and night for the slain of the daughter of my people! ²Oh, that I had in the wilderness a lodging place for travelers; that I might leave my people, and go from them!

0:24:19

Notice, Jeremiah understood those amongst whom he dwelt.

For they are all adulterers, an assembly of treacherous men.

These are God's own people.

³"And like their bow they have bent their tongues for lies. They are not valiant for the truth on the earth. For they proceed from evil to evil, and they do not know Me," says Yehovah. ⁴"Everyone take heed to his neighbor, and do not trust any brother; for every brother will utterly supplant, and every neighbor will walk with slanderers. ⁵Everyone will deceive his neighbor, and will not speak the truth; they have taught their tongue to speak lies; they weary themselves to commit iniquity. ⁶Your dwelling place is in the midst of deceit; through deceit they refuse to know Me," says Yehovah.

0:25:27

This is God's perspective of His people who will not listen to him. Going on in verse 12:

¹²Who is the wise man who may understand this? And who is he to whom the mouth of Yehovah has spoken, that he may declare it? Why does the land perish and burn up like a wilderness, so that no one can pass through? ¹³And Yehovah said, "Because they have forsaken My law which I set before them, and have not obeyed My voice, nor walked according to it, ¹⁴but they have walked according to the dictates of their own hearts and after the Baals, which their fathers taught them," ¹⁵therefore thus says Yehovah of hosts, the God of Israel: "Behold, I will feed them, this people, with wormwood, and give them water of gall to drink. ¹⁶I will scatter them also among the Gentiles, whom neither they nor their fathers have known. And I will send a sword after them until I have consumed them."

0:26:26

You know, this is all about prior to the actual invasion by Nebuchadnezzar; God sent His prophet to warn them and show them the evils that they have done and their departure from God.

0:26:47

Let's go to Jeremiah 11, verses 6 – 17

⁶Then Yehovah said to me, "Proclaim all these words in the cities of Judah and in the streets of Jerusalem, saying: 'Hear the words of this covenant and do them. ⁷For I earnestly exhorted your fathers in the day I brought them up out of the land of Egypt, until this day, rising early and exhorting, saying, "Obey My voice." ⁸ Yet they did not obey or incline their ear, but everyone followed the dictates of his evil heart;

0:27:25

We can begin to see this recurring pattern and to do things contrary to God's commandments and statutes and judgements is regarded by our Father as evil.

therefore, I will bring upon them all the words of this covenant, which I commanded them to do, but which they have not done." ⁹And Yehovah said to me, "A conspiracy has been found among the men of Judah and among the inhabitants of Jerusalem. ¹⁰They have turned back to the iniquities of their forefathers who refused to hear My words, and they have gone after other gods to serve them; the house of Israel and the house of Judah have broken My covenant which I made with their fathers." ¹¹Therefore thus says Yehovah: "Behold, I will surely bring

0:28:14

It says calamity here, but in the King James, it says:

I will surely bring (evil) on them which they will not be able to escape; and though they cry out to Me, I will not listen to them. ¹²Then the cities of Judah and the inhabitants of Jerusalem will go and cry out to the gods to whom they offer incense, but they will not save them at all in the time of their trouble. ¹³For according to the number of your cities were your gods, O Judah; and according to the number of the streets of Jerusalem you have set up altars to that shameful thing, altars to burn incense to Baal. ¹⁴"So do not pray for this people, or lift up a cry or prayer for them; for I will not hear them in the time that they cry out to Me because of their trouble. ¹⁵"What has My beloved to do in My house, having done lewd deeds with many? And the holy flesh has passed from you. When you do evil, then you rejoice. ¹⁶Yehovah called your name, Green Olive Tree, lovely and of Good Fruit. With the noise of a great tumult, He has kindled fire on it, and its branches are broken. ¹⁷"For Yehovah of hosts, who planted you, has pronounced doom against you for the evil of the house of Israel and of the house of Judah, which they have done against themselves to provoke Me to anger in offering incense to Baal."

0:29:48

It should be apparent to us, after reading this, that worship in any form other than how God has instituted it, is not well received at all. And we can begin to see the entire world having divorced themselves from the worship of the true God.

0:30:11 Jeremiah 13, (verse 1)

¹ Thus Yehovah said to me: "Go and get yourself a linen sash, and put it around your waist, but do not put it in water." ²So I got a sash according to the word of Yehovah.

When God tells us to do something, we are supposed to do it.

and put it around my waist. ³And the word of Yehovah came to me the second time, saying, ⁴"Take the sash that you acquired, which is around your waist, and arise, go to the Euphrates, and hide it there in a hole in the rock." ⁵So I went and hid it by the Euphrates, as Yehovah commanded me. ⁶Now it came to pass after many days that Yehovah said to me, "Arise, go to the Euphrates, and take from there the sash which I commanded you to hide there." ⁷Then I went to the Euphrates and dug, and I took the sash from the place where I had hidden it; and there was the sash, ruined. It was profitable for nothing. ⁸Then the word of Yehovah came to me, saying, ⁹"Thus says Yehovah: 'In this manner I will ruin the pride of Judah and the great pride of Jerusalem. ¹⁰This evil people,

who refuse to hear My words, who follow the dictates of their hearts, and walk after other Gods to serve them and worship them, shall be just like this sash which is profitable for nothing. ¹¹For as the sash clings to the waist of a man, so I have caused the whole house of Israel and the whole house of Judah to cling to Me,' says Yehovah, 'that they may become My people, for renown, for praise, and for glory; but they would not hear.'

0:31:57 Jeremiah 16, let's take a look at verses 9 – 13

⁹For thus says Yehovah of hosts, the God of Israel: "Behold, I will cause to cease from this place, before your eyes and in your days, the voice of mirth and the voice of gladness, the voice of the bridegroom and the voice of the bride. ¹⁰"And it shall be, when you show this people all these words, and they say to you, 'Why has Yehovah pronounced all this great disaster (great evil) against us? Or what is our iniquity? Or what is our sin that we have committed against Yehovah our God?'

0:32:39 Perhaps they just didn't know.

¹¹Then you shall say to them, 'Because your fathers have forsaken Me,' says Yehovah; 'they have walked after other gods and have served them and worshiped

them, and have forsaken Me and not kept My law. ¹²And you have done worse than your fathers, for behold, each one follows the dictates of his own evil heart, so that no one listens to Me.

0:33:10

How many people actually listen to God now?

¹³Therefore I will cast you out of this land into a land that you do not know, neither you nor your fathers; and there you shall serve other gods day and night, where I will not show you favor.'

You've selected other foreign gods, well, go serve them and see how that works out for you. God will bring evil upon people who choose evil.

0:33:40

And when we are looking at the word evil it can refer to the actual situation where God would bring evil against the nation in punishment for their rejection of Him. And we also have to look at where evil is defined as departing from God. So, the word *evil* has a spectrum of meanings, and we need to be cognizant of that, whether it's talking about a specific event being evil, or whether it's an explanation from God of what evil actually is. And context will show us that and tell us that if we are willing to look.

0:34:26

Let's go on in Jeremiah 17, and we will read verses 19 – 27. Jeremiah 17, verse 19

¹⁹Thus Yehovah said to me: "Go and stand in the gate of the children of the people, by which the kings of Judah come in and by which they go out, and in all the gates of Jerusalem; ²⁰and say to them, 'Hear the word of Yehovah, you kings of Judah, and all Judah, and all the inhabitants of Jerusalem, who enter by these gates.

0:35:03

Can you imagine walking in Jeremiah's shoes and saying, "Hey, here's the word of God to you." I'm glad it was him and not me.

²¹Thus says Yehovah: "Take heed to yourselves, and bear no burden on the Sabbath day, nor bring it in by the gates of Jerusalem;

Does the Father want people, in this case His called and chosen people, to honor the Sabbath day? Is it evil to not honor the Sabbath day?

²² nor carry a burden out of your houses on the Sabbath day, nor do any work, but hallow the Sabbath day, as I commanded your fathers.

So, to not do that is regarded by our Father as evil. Do we see it that way?

²³But they did not obey nor incline their ear, but made their neck stiff, that they might not hear nor receive instruction. ²⁴"And it shall be, if you heed Me carefully," says the Lord, "to bring no burden through the gates of this city on the Sabbath day, but hallow the Sabbath day, to do no work in it, ²⁵then shall enter the gates of this city kings and princes sitting on the throne of David, riding in chariots and on horses, they and their princes, accompanied by the men of Judah and the inhabitants of Jerusalem; and this city shall remain forever. ²⁶And they shall come from the cities of Judah and from the places around Jerusalem, from the land of Benjamin and from the lowland, from the mountains and from the South, bringing burnt offerings and sacrifices, grain offerings and incense, bringing sacrifices of praise to the House of God. ²⁷"But if you will not heed Me to hallow the Sabbath day, such as not carrying a burden when entering the gates of Jerusalem on the Sabbath day, then I will kindle a fire in its gates, and it shall devour the palaces of Jerusalem, and it shall not be quenched."""

Is that important to our Father? Is it evil to not do so?

0:37:20

Jeremiah 18, we'll read verses 6 – 11.

⁶"O house of Israel, can I not do with you as this potter?" says Yehovah. "Look, as the clay is in the potter's hand, so are you in My hand, O house of Israel! ⁷The instant I speak concerning a nation and concerning a kingdom, to pluck up, to pull down, and to destroy it, ⁸if that nation against whom I have spoken turns from its evil.

And begins obeying God.

I will relent of the disaster that I thought to bring upon it. ⁹And the instant I speak concerning a nation and concerning a kingdom, to build and to plant it, ¹⁰if it does evil in My sight so that it does not obey My voice,

0:38:13

What does God actually think about his voice?

then I will relent concerning the good with which I said I would benefit it. ¹¹"Now therefore, speak to the men of Judah and to the inhabitants of Jerusalem, saying, 'Thus says Yehovah: "Behold, I am fashioning a disaster (evil) and devising a plan against you. Return now everyone from his evil way, and make your ways and your doings good."""

0:38:46

It's always the same thing. Does Yehovah think in terms of being evil or something being good? If we, the ekklesia, are to discern good and evil, should they not be in the same terms? Christ certainly did. Now when we read of His comment, these are the things that come out of an evil heart.

0:39:33

Even Pilate, when he was questioning the Jews about Christ, said, "What evil has He done?" Do we think in terms of things being evil, or not? Do we think in terms of people doing things, including ourselves, that are contrary to commandments and the wishes of our Father? What do you think? Jeremiah came to understand, or understood something that we read of in Jeremiah 23, and we'll read verses 9 – 15.

0:40:21

Let's pick it up here:
